Message from the President and Managing Director

In 2016 Fight Cancer Foundation supported thousands of people, continuing our mission of giving hope and saving the lives of people living with cancer.

Our work is testament to the families who are in the fight of their lives and the commitment of our supporters and volunteers whose dedication makes our work possible.

This year saw the growth of our programs to help even more families in need, including the first intake of young learners in our education support program at Adelaide's Women's and Children's Hospital. The first dedicated education support program for children with cancer from South Australia and the Northern Territory, the program is delivered in partnership with the Child Development School SA Hospital School, supported by TeamKids – Women's & Children's Hospital Foundation.

Comfortable and affordable short and long term accommodation continues to be a much-needed way Fight Cancer Foundation is able to support families fighting against cancer and other life-threatening illnesses. Throughout the year, our centres in Albury, Hobart and Melbourne operated at almost capacity, providing a safe haven during difficult and uncertain times.

Fight Cancer Foundation's longstanding commitment to research into improved treatment methods for leukaemia and other blood disorders continues through our relationship with Melbourne Health and The Royal Melbourne Hospital. The research produced this year provides tangible positive clinical results for people fighting against blood disorders in Australia and around the world.

In 2016, the BMDI Cord Blood Bank in Melbourne celebrated 20 years of providing a second chance at life, as well as developing ground-breaking research that works towards revolutionary stem cell transplants to help people with a wide range of illnesses around the world. Since its establishment in 1996, the BMDI Cord Blood Bank has stored more than 11,831 cord blood units ready for transplant and has released more than 540 units for life-saving transplants around the world.

Our longstanding involvement with the Australian Bone Marrow Donor Registry continues through our representation on the Board of Directors, ensuring the future strategic direction and capabilities of Fight Cancer Foundation's first project. The Registry continues to provide a second chance at life for patients with blood and immune disorders around Australia and across the globe.

2016 marked the passing of Fight Cancer Foundation founding member and past Chairman, Mrs Fay Duncan AM. For more than 25 years, Fay worked tirelessly to make a real difference in the lives of people fighting against blood disorders and her dedication touched the lives of countless people around the world.

Our work is only possible due to the dedication of our Patrons, Ambassadors, volunteer directors and committee members, office staff, corporate supporters and our selfless volunteers. Thank you to our regular financial supporters who continue to support our work and enable us to achieve our mission of giving hope and saving lives of people living with cancer.

Education Support Program

In 2016, Fight Cancer Foundation supported more than 1,400 students across Australia while they received treatment for cancer. Our specially designed education program ensures children and young people stay engaged in their learning while absent from school.

Students range from three years to 18 years of age. Working with specialist education advisors and teachers to maintain their connections with their schools and peers, and reducing the isolation of cancer treatment and ensuring transition back to their regular school environment as easily as possible.

Fight Cancer Foundation’s education support programs operate at the Children’s Hospital at Westmead (NSW), the Royal Children’s Hospital (VIC), Sydney Children’s Hospital Randwick (NSW) and the Women’s and Children’s Hospital (SA). Our team of teachers and support staff work with families and schools to develop individual support and learning plans that meet the educational, social and welfare needs of young learners. They also provide tutoring and one-on-one learning activities, as well as much needed fun, support, diversion and motivation to engage with their education while undergoing difficult and ongoing treatment and recovery.

Accommodation Centres

In 2016, Fight Cancer Foundation's centres in Albury, Hobart and Melbourne provided almost 10,000 nights' accommodation for seriously ill patients and their families.

Most families staying in our centres face long distance travel to access medical treatment and their stay can be for a night or two or for many months. The home-away-from-home atmosphere relieves some of the emotional burden caused by serious illness, while the affordable nature of our facilities relieves some of the financial stress patients and their families can experience during an uncertain time.

Throughout 2016, our centres operated at near full capacity, demonstrating the need for comfortable, affordable, single and family accommodation in metropolitan and regional areas. Particularly, with the opening of the Albury Wodonga Regional Cancer Centre, our Hilltop accommodation centre in Albury became a valuable resource for families travelling for treatment from regional and remote Victoria and southern New South Wales.

In 2016, the BMDI Cord Blood Bank celebrated 20 years of giving people living with cancer a second chance at life. During the year the Cord Blood Bank collected, tested and banked more than 600 additional cord blood units, taking the total of units held ready for transplant to more than 11,000.

Operated by Fight Cancer Foundation in conjunction with the Murdoch Children's Research Institute and The Royal Children's Hospital, BMDI Cord Blood Bank is one of three public cord blood banks in Australia which form the AusCord network of public cord

blood banks. Working closely with the Australian Bone Marrow Donor Registry, the banks source and provide cord blood for patients who need a stem cell transplant for the treatment of leukaemia and other life-threatening illnesses.

Three cord blood collection centres supply cord blood units to BMDI Cord Blood Bank: The Royal Women's Hospital, Angliss Hospital, and Box Hill Hospital. We thank the generous new parents whose selfless gift provides a second chance at life for families around the world.

In 2016, Fight Cancer Foundation supported ground-breaking research into better treatment outcomes for people fighting blood disorders.

For more than 25 years, Fight Cancer Foundation has worked with Melbourne Health and The Royal Melbourne Hospital to fund translational research into blood disorders. Cancers of the blood – leukaemias, lymphomas and multiple myeloma – affect people of all ages and are one of the largest causes of cancer death in Australia. The ongoing translation of laboratory and clinical research to clinical practice and policy creates better patient outcomes.

Researchers working at The Royal Melbourne Hospital are dedicated to finding the answers to the infinite questions raised by cancer. Their work at the ACRF Translational Haematological Laboratory paves the way by applying basic science knowledge to samples of patients to create new treatment pathways.

Additionally, Fight Cancer Foundation's research scholarship program offers the next generation of cancer scientists the opportunity to investigate new avenues of research, providing knowledge breakthroughs that will ultimately help find a cure.

Jason Mahoney was diagnosed with Acute Lymphoblastic Leukaemia in 2009. Jason required a bone marrow transplant, which meant he and his family had to relocate to BMDI Rotary House in North Melbourne while he received treatment. Jason fought hard, but ultimately lost his fight.

To honour Jason's memory, CureTour was developed by Gary Carnell, Jason's brother-in-law. Six years later CureTour is still going strong. In October, 10 everyday Australian guys - and two support crew - rode 1300 gruelling kilometres from Adelaide to Geelong over eight long days.



While it was a tough journey, it was worth it - the CureTOUR team raised more than \$101,000 to support people living with cancer.

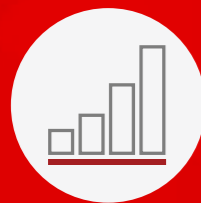
Kate Nicholls

The consolidated surplus of the companies for 2016 was deficit - \$1,031,328 (2015 surplus \$1,154,689).

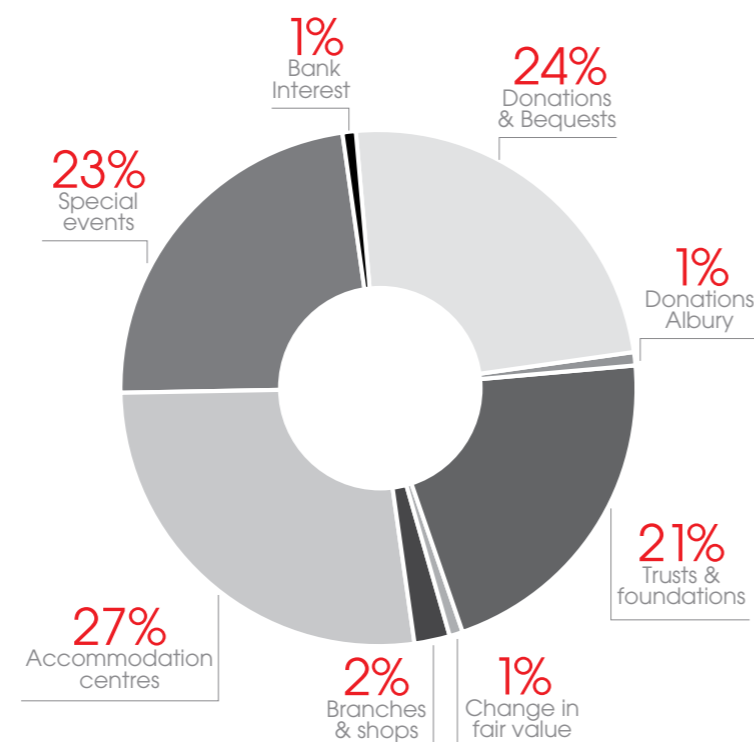

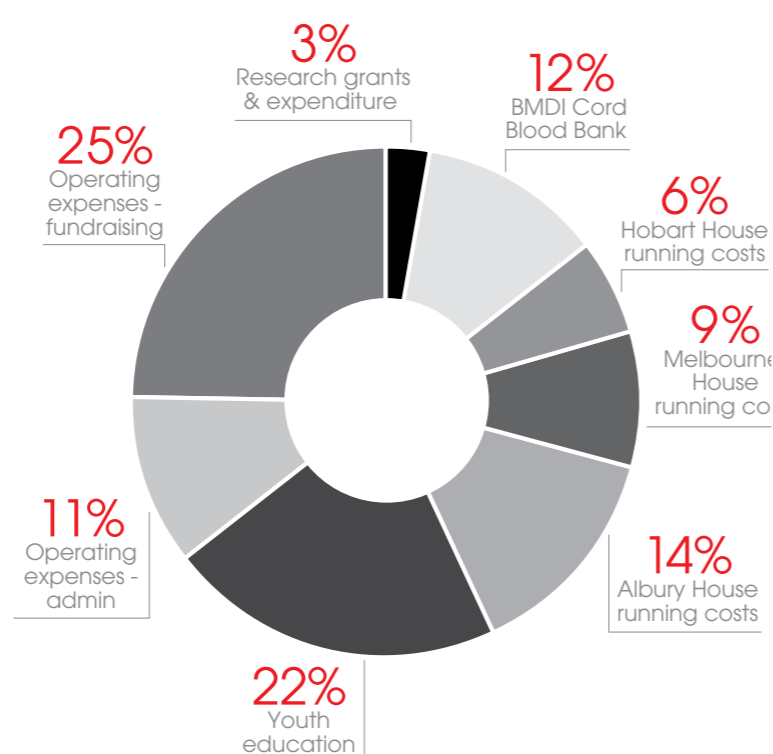

Revenue



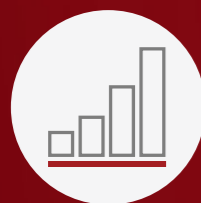
Expenditure
